

### What do you do for fun in our area?


Golf and taking Remy out - Berger Dog Park in Smyrna is good. I'm looking forward to having a beer and enjoying the patio and backyard with friends.

In Paulette Jiles' 2016 novel News of the World, Civil War veteran Capt. Jefferson Kyle Kidd travels through Texas reading newspapers to eager audiences. He is pulled into a drama when he meets Johanna Leonberger, age 10, kidnapped 4 years earlier by Kiowa warriors who murdered her family. The tribe is tired of being harassed by the cavalry about her and sell her back to an Indian agent. When Kidd is offered a \$50 gold piece by the agent to take her from the only people she remembers to distant family she doesn't know, he resists, until his conscience moves him.


Now begins a harrowing and nearly disastrous journey and a shootout with bad guys so gripping you believe you are a part a movie instead of safe with a book.

As they travel, the Captain and Johanna slowly bond. The Kirkus' Review describes the book as "lyrical and affecting," and says that it "succeeds in skirt[ing] clichés through its empathy and narrative skill."

Now out on Prime Demand, the film stars Tom Hanks as the Captain and Helena Zengel as Johanna and was directed by Paul Greenglass.

Will the movie be as good as the book? Will the end be the same?

As is said in the movie's trailer, this is a story of "men and women very much like you and me."
